SCHOLARSHIPS AT REDMAIDS' HIGH

Students joining Redmaids' High into any year group can be considered for a scholarship. These will be awarded on a tiered basis, offering awards at a bronze, silver or gold level.

Internal students are welcome to apply for scholarships when moving up to Year 7, 10 and 12, however if we see a student with exceptional ability or potential at any point during their time in the senior school, we will suggest that they be put forward for the scholar's programme.

Academic Scholarships:

There will be approximately 10 academic scholarships on offer each year, at a mix of bronze, silver and gold levels.

Bronze = enrollment into the academic scholars programme of events and opportunities including support and mentorship from the Head and Senior Leadership Team.

Silver = Bronze plus an annual £200 contribution to be spent on their area of interest.

Gold = Bronze plus a 25% fee discount. Reserved for those who display truly exceptional academic aptitude.

Any fee-remittance for bronze and silver scholars will be purely on a means-tested basis. Means-tested scholarships could be up to 100%.

Sports Scholarships

The number offered each academic year, will depend entirely on the skill set of the group and awarded on a tiered basis.

Bronze = mentoring and masterclasses. For example, specialist strength and conditioning lessons.

Silver = Bronze plus a financial award of £200 for kit, training or equipment granted on a yearly basis

Gold = Bronze plus a 25% fee discount. Reserved for highly elite athletes.

Music Scholarships:

The number offered each academic year, will depend entirely on the skill set of the group and awarded on a tiered basis.

Bronze = mentoring and masterclasses. Accompaniment support in lessons from Head of Keyboard Studies. Support in ABRSM exams with accompanist provided. Subsidised school trips.

Silver = Free music lessons in chosen instrument that will be granted on a yearly basis.

Gold = Bronze plus a 25% fee discount. Reserved for highly elite performers.



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Development Grants:

These will be financial awards that any student can apply for during their time at Redmaids' High. This might be for a piece of equipment to further a student's studies or interests, or entrance to a conference or event about a subject that a student is particularly passionate about. These will be launched to due course.

Bursaries

We offer a number of fully and partially-funded places each academic year, on a means-tested basis. As a broad guide, most bursaries offer up to 50% discount on the fees, although we do have a number of fully-funded places available for able and ambitious students who perform very well on the entrance examination. The assessment of a family's means, takes parents' or guardians' income and the value of capital assets into consideration. More information on applying for a bursary is set out in the Bursary Policy.

Special awards for entrance into Year 7

For those joining at Year 7, two fully-funded places – the John Whitson Award and the Florence Edith Rowbotham Award – are available.

The John Whitson Award

This is a means-tested, 100% scholarship given to a girl who can demonstrate academic ability in the Year 7 Entrance Examination and who would be unable to attend Redmaids' High School without this financial assistance.

The Florence Edith Rowbotham Award

This provides a 100% fully funded place. It is awarded at the discretion of the Head (on the basis of wider criteria) to a girl who has done well in the Year 7 Entrance Examination. Parents are invited to contact the school to discuss any special circumstances.

The Gillian Rowcliffe Award

For a girl moving internally from Year 6 to Year 7, the Gillian Rowcliffe award, named after the former Headteacher of Redmaids' High Juniors, recognizes excellent entrance examination results combined with a contribution to student life whilst in the junior school.
